What Is the CERD?

The CERD is a site for research, creation, and collaboration. In this facility, **we study communication problems** through the application of a variety of research strategies and methodologies. For example, we can assess how viewers interact with a web site: where they click, what draws and holds their attention, how quickly they move from page to page, and what confuses or frustrates them. **We apply that knowledge to create more-effective information products.**

The CERD is also a space where **we create** a diverse array of **information products**, including web sites, hypertexts, interactive tutorials, videos, instructions, reports, electronic books, and podcasts. (Yes, we design a lot of things.)

What Resources Does the CERD Offer?

The CERD is equipped with industry-standard tools for research and design. In the **User Experience Lab**, we implement Gazepoint *GP3* ux software and eye-tracking technologies plus a variety of recording technologies to study users in action with information and devices. We create communication solutions in the **Audio & Video Production Studio** and the **Information Design Lab** with Adobe *Creative Cloud* packages and TechSmith *Camtasia*. We are well equipped for in-studio and field recording of audio and video. Our **UX Studio** and **MakerSpace** facility offer sites for interaction and ideation.

Where Is the CERD?

The CERD includes five facilities in four spaces: the **User Experience Lab** (Curtiss Hall 143), the **Information Design Lab** (C143), the **UX Studio & Collaboration Space** (C151), the **MakerSpace Lab** (C155), and the **Audio & Video Production Studio** (C148).

Who Is the CERD?

The CERD is a collaborative space that is administered by the Department of Rhetoric and Professional Writing on behalf of the university. The CERD is host to the **Usability Research Team** (URT), an interdisciplinary research and design consultancy who works with a variety of clients. Faculty-lead projects draw on the talents of undergraduate students from technical writing, education, and other disciplines, including graphic design.
